Incorporate a variety of teaching materials, such as textbooks, literature, videos, and resources, that represent diverse cultures, perspectives, and experiences. This helps students see themselves reflected in the curriculum and promotes a broader understanding of the world.

ADDRESS BIAS AND STEREOTYPES




